Emphasising The global economy's dependence on Fossil Fuels, Plastics and various environmentally damaging practices in producing all types of goods.

Bearing in mind the vitality of gradual change in order to achieve sustainable

Reminding all nations of the vitality of policy change in order to prevent the average 1.5°C increase globally and to reduce, eliminate and navigate the possible risks facing the world by 2030.

1. Recommends member states to prepare for an increasing number of climate refugees, by:

- a) Temporary camps for refugees, which should provide:
 - i. Education
 - ii. Sanitary facilities
 - iii. Work possibilities
- b) living programs for long term settling of refugees which:
 - i. Re-educate refugees in host countries culture and customs
 - ii. Build affordable housing;

2. Urges all member states to lower their CO₂ emissions by 35% by 2035 by the means of but not limited to:

- a) Replacing coal power plants with solar, wind and geothermal as well as nuclear alternatives which will be partially funded by more developed nations,
- b) Increased funding and research into nuclear power sources,
- c) Education centres for long term solutions where students will learn about the importance of being environmentally aware of their actions;

3. Endorses research into carbon-fixation as a short term solution to the climate crisis by collaboration of nations to ensure this success;

4. Strongly supports an increase in regulation in regards to fracking and oil drilling with regulations such as:

- a) Protecting national areas;
- b) Market incentive to move to renewables;

5. Requests economic aid from developed nations to ensure that projects in developing states can reach emission goals and that further economic aid should be given to aid in states that rely on the export of fossil fuels with the aim to gradually shift a greener economic focus.

6) Suggests all nations suffering from droughts to perform rain dances to increase rainfall.

- a) Locals will be taught by professionals on how to properly perform the dance
- b) A variety of different dances ranging from different cultures will be implemented (e.g North American, African and Chinese rain dance rituals)
